You've seen our staff leave comfort behind, bringing fearful moms and kids to safety. You've watched our Shelter taking in families who've fled for their lives, and our Restoration Project repairing broken walls. You've stood with our staff as they held open the Day Center doors to our teenagers for showers, cooking, games, prayer, and counseling, not knowing if the building would stand another night.

Our staff has also absorbed the new needs of wartime. They're trust-builders, rewiring joy and hope. In the new emergency of indefinite war, they help our youth in Zhytomyr see they still have a future.



The locals took care of us, people who are not indifferent to others' grief. Tonight, for the first time in seven days, we and our children slept peacefully.

December 31:

THE NETHERLANDS

April 2:

We were greeted very kindly... Volunteers are assigned to each house to help. Today we had a festive lunch and soup for dinner. We also have a house with a large hall where we can gather to pray together.

Twenty-four rockets were fired at our hometown. The moms are all worried about their relatives. We pray for peace in Ukraine, for our city, and for people who wake up in danger every day.



July 10:

I'm watching kids playing on the trampolines and wondering, would I be right to take away our children's peaceful skies and put them back in those basements listening to sirens? I ask God every day for the right decision. Millions of moms every day risk their children's safety or their ability to be with their dad. A choice that no family in any country should have to make.




WHERE ARE WE IN THE WAR?


Since the first weeks of the war, most missiles flying over our region have been shot down. Few residences have been damaged, but utilities have been struck frequently, leaving many without heat or water.

ORPHANED PARENTS ENDURE WAR

Olya's son Kiril was born in the first week of the war. She lived with family, then evacuated to the Czech Republic, then came back to Ukraine. When the baby's father left her, she was alone. She and Kiril were both frightened by the shelling. After family camp, she came to our Shelter Crisis Housing facility.

Olya wrote, "I thank God that He protects me and gave me the opportunity to understand that not all people are cruel. I want to thank the people who help us... Since I moved to the Shelter, I have changed a lot for the better. The more I learn about God, the more I thank Him that I am surrounded by these kind people."


The outpouring of humanitarian aid has been huge, and we can account for every dollar. We have shared the love of God with all who needed it.


Please pray with us for the safety and well-being of all of our friends and loved ones, including our orphaned youth, many of whom have been drafted to fight.


